"Christmas for me has always been a double-edged sword actually from my 20s," confesses James. For five years in a row she worked as an actress in Christmas shows. With rehearsals starting in October and performances running through to early January, she spent around three months warbling seasonal songs, attired always in a mix of reds and greens. "It was just a nightmare!" she says with a laugh.

"I do enjoy the spirit of Christmas, but I also understand that there is a certain commercialism that is attached... so it's kind of just taking the candy coating off the holiday."

Building on those emotions, she's put together a pair of one-person plays that cheekily poke fun at the excessive sentimentality of the occasion. The first to catch her eye was writer David Sedaris' The Santaland Diaries, the piece that first brought the humorous essayist to public attention. Describing the woes of Crumpet, a depart-

ment store elf, it was later adapted for the stage by Joe Mantello and has been a popular staple in regional theater ever since.

Coupled with this is The 12 Dates of Christmas, one woman's journey through a dozen rendezvous that range from mildly successful to colossal disaster, spread over the course of a year.

Winter is the time for feasting, and in recognition of this urge to gorge, audience members will be able to munch on bites from a snack buffet during the interval, washed down by a complimentary drink – followed by as many more beverages as you care to purchase. After all, 'tis the season to be jolly!
